

TWIN CITY LITTLE LEAGUE FAQ'S

Q: How is the league funded?

A: The league is completely self funded through our registration fees, concession income, various fundraisers, donations from community organizations, and field advertisement sponsorships. TCLL receives no funding from local municipalities.

Q: Are there any paid positions to maintain facilities and perform the day to day operations of the league?

A: No. TCLL is 100% volunteer and relies mainly upon the 14 board members elected annually to run the program. We also depend on the generosity of parent volunteers throughout the season.

Q: How are my registration fees allocated and distributed by the league?

A: There are many different ways that registration fees are used. Here are just a few examples:

- National little league charter, player insurance and property insurance
- Purchase of uniforms and hats
- New playing equipment (catchers gear, batting helmets, and baseballs)
- Facility maintenance upgrades and field maintenance equipment
- Utility bills (water, electric and trash service)
- Pay for umpires
- Office expenses (copies, ink, and advertisement)

Q: Why am I required to give a concession deposit?

A: Without the concession deposit, it would be impossible to secure a steady flow of volunteers to operate our stand. The deposit is simply a way to ensure staffing for the concession stand during games.

Q: When I pay my concession deposit what are my responsibilities to get that deposit back?

A: TCLL only asks that a parent, grandparent, aunt/uncle, or anyone representing a registered player work 2 one-hour shifts. Those shifts can be consecutive or split up at your convenience. After those two hours have been completed you will receive the same deposit you paid at registration. The league will not cash a deposit check until the season is complete.

Q: Can I surrender my concession deposit if I do not have time to work in the stand?

A: Yes. During registration, simply ask one of our volunteers for a surrender form, and you will be able to opt out.

Q: What is the skills assessment?

A: The skills assessment is used as a placement tool for our draft to ensure parity within the league. The assessment is done by board members and area high school baseball players.
